Summary of Rulemaking Action:

The Office of Child Support Services made DBR aware that one of the regulation's provisions conflicts with state law as to confidential information on a return or proof of service. As a result, DBR has proposed an amendment to § 1.9 (E) that adds an exception to the proof/return requirements to account for Office of Child Support Services' responsibility to keep domestic violence victims' addresses confidential pursuant R.I. Gen. Laws § 15-22-4 and § 15-22-5.

The Department does not expect these proposed amendments to be controversial. The proposed rule will take effect thirty (30) days after publication if no objection is received.

The Agency does not expect this filing to be controversial and therefore, a public hearing will not be held.

If no formal objection is received on or before March 28, 2022, the Department of Business Regulation (includes the Office of the Health Insurance Commissioner) will file the Amendment and the Final Rule will take effect on this date.
