The proposed amendments pertain to sub-permittee prohibitions regarding handling raptors and rabies-vector species, Level 1 apprenticeship requirements, application requirements, non rabies vector rehabilitated release exceptions, and rabies vector orphaned, young rehabilitation exceptions.

Regulatory Analysis Summary and Supporting Documentation:

The proposed revisions are necessary to update the regulation to the current RI Code of Regulations format and dod not impose any new requirements. These regulations as codified would not have a financial impact on persons who are licensed by the Division of Fish and WIIdlife to perform WiIdlife Rehabilition in the State of Rhode Island. The Division moved regulatory language that existed in a guidance document for the Nuisance WiIdlife Control Specialist and by moving this language into regulation it makes them enforceable by the Division of Law Enforcement as they were intended to be. Nuisance WiIdlife Control Specialist for the State already abide by these regulations, including the language previously contained in the guidance document.
