**In re: Proposed revisions to Air Pollution Control Regulation
No. 22 “Air Toxics”**

DECISION

Introduction

On October 30, 2018 a notice was posted on the websites of the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management (RI DEM) and the Rhode Island Office of Secretary of State and was sent to interested parties announcing a public comment period to accept comments on the adoption of proposed revisions to Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 22, Air Toxics (250-RICR-120-05-22). The notice stated that a public hearing would be held if requested by twenty-five or more people, a governmental agency or subdivisions, or an association having not less than twenty-five members. No requests for a public hearing were received. The public comment period ended at 4:00 PM on November 30, 2018.


The purpose of this regulation is to limit emissions of toxic air contaminant from stationary sources. The Department is proposing to remove acetone from the list of toxic air contaminants in Part 22. Portions of the regulation that no longer apply have been eliminated. The regulation has been updated to current RI Code of Regulations (RICR) format. There are no new requirements being proposed.

There were no comments were received on the proposed revisions to Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 22, Air Toxics (250-RICR-120-05-22).

Decision

It is the decision of the Department to adopt the proposed revisions to Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 22, “Air Toxics” (250-RICR-120-05-22), as proposed. The final amended regulation is appended to this Decision.
