Summary of Rulemaking Action:

The purpose of these Rules and Regulations is to establish recreational hunting seasons; to set the possession and bag limits; and to regulate the manner of hunting in order to efficiently manage the wildlife resources of Rhode Island.

The Rhode Island Hunting and Trapping Regulations for the 2019 - 2020 and 2020 - 2021 seasons went out for public hearing May 6th, 2019 and were filed July 11th, 2019. It has come to our attention that there is a critical error in the season dates outlined in section 9.11(B)(3)(a) regarding the late Canada goose season.

Regulatory Analysis Summary and Supporting Documentation:

The purpose of these Rules and Regulations is to establish recreational hunting

seasons; to set the possession and bag limits; and to regulate the manner of hunting in order to efficiently manage the wildlife resources of Rhode Island. There are new season dates for hunting as well as grammatical changes, removal of redundant lanuage, sections reworded, additional species and bag limits added for those species.
