Summary of Rulemaking Action:

- Section 2.7.5(D)(1)(b)(2): Rule incorrectly refers to "medical hardship" regarding the activity standard criteria for the issuance of new licenses. Should be "Incapacity", as a new license is only issued in instances of incapacity; a temporary "operator permit" is issued in instances of medical hardship.
- Section 2.7.5(D)(1)(b)(2)): Change the activity standard criteria for the date that landings must have occurred from 2006 to 2010 for the issuance of new licenses in instances of incapacity. The year 2006 was established in rule when initially adopted in 2016 due to reliability of reporting data since 2006, and to capture the most recent 10 years. Proposed rule change is to maintain a consistent ten year period that landings must have occurred from the time of the incapacity to meet the activity standard.
- <u>Section 2.7.5(E)(5)(a)):</u> Clarify that an activity standard must be met as a requirement for eligibility consistent with R.I. Gen Laws §20-2.1-5(5).
- <u>Section 2.7.5(G)(1)(f)):</u> Add prioritization criteria for the issuance of new licenses and endorsements for veterans, to account for fishing activity lost during active military service.
- Clarify meaning of control dates for the soft-shell clam fishery and the purse seine/mid-water/pair trawl fisheries: Clarify that the established control dates are for the potential use in establishing eligibility criteria for future access to the fishery, but that no rule is currently in effect relative to the control date. This proposal does not establish a new or amend an existing control date.
- <u>Direct Sale Dealer License (proposed new section 2.7.9(F))):</u>
 - o Background:

- Rule adopted in April 2020 via emergency action in response to Covid-19.
- Authorizes the direct sale of allowable finfish and crustacean species from the fisherman directly to consumers and licensed seafood retailers dockside from the vessel on which they were harvested.
- Proposed rule establishes applicability, eligibility, general requirements, prohibited activities not authorized by the license, storage and handling requirements, reporting requirements, and fee.
- Other non-substantive clarifications throughout rule.
