Summary of Rulemaking Action:

Summary of Rulemaking Action: The regulatory changes proposed in this filing are identical to the regulatory language currently in effect as of 10/01/2023. The effective version was originally noticed for public comment on 08/31/2023. During that public comment period, a technical error within the RICR system may have prevented comments submitted through RICR's attachment field from being received by the agency. Any comments submitted directly through RICR's text box option (with no attachments) or submitted directly to the agency were processed successfully. As a result of the technical error, the agency is repromulgating the regulatory changes (effective as of 10/01/2023 to ensure that the public has full access to submit public comments as originally intended. The regulatory language included in this notice redlines changes made in the most recent promulgation. The agency is noticing these changes for additional public comment. comment.

To comply with and implement Federally mandated increases to the Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLA) for recipients of the SupplementalNutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) program. Other amendments include the Federally mandated implementation of modified Able-Bodied Adults WithoutDependents (ABAWD) time limit exceptions per FNS under the FiscalResponsibility Act 2023, and implementation of the Excessive Replacement CardNotice per FNS policy (276.6b.6). Lastly, a change to gender-neutral pronounsthroughout the regulation to

be more inclusive.

Amendments include: The modified ABAWD exemptions per FNSunder the Fiscal Responsibility Act 2023, at 1.11.9; the FY 2024 COLAAdjustments at 1.5.7 and 1.15; the addition of the Excessive Replacement CardNotice at 1.16 per FNS policy 274.6.b.6; and the inclusion of gender-neutralpronouns.

The Agency does not expect this filing to be controversial and therefore, a public hearing will not be held.

Additional Information and Public Comments:

If no formal objection is received on or before December 15, 2023, the Department of Human Services will file the Amendment and the Final Rule will take effect on this date.

Regulatory Analysis Summary and Supporting Documentation:

To meet the needs of individuals and families experiencing foodinsecurity, benefit amounts and deductions have increased to reflect recentchanges in cost of living due to inflation. The addition of the new exception definitions to the ABAWD time limit under the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 recognizes the barriers facing homeless, veterans, and extended foster care individuals and exempts that population from ABAWD requirements. The change to the EBT policy eliminates the requirement of contacting DHS staff prior to the5th card replacement, so there will be no withholding of the 5th or more card.
