RIDOH is proposing rulemaking in order to revise definitions section for consistency, revise the definitions for "adjudicatory proceeding," "reasonable litigation expenses," and "substantial justification," clarify the requirements for applications for awards of reasonable litigation expenses, allowance of awards, and disallowance of awards, and revise the appeals section to directly cite to applicable statute.
