This regulation is being created to include all lead training and licensing rules and regulations originally found in the Lead Poisoning and Prevention regulation (216-RICR-50-15-3). The regulation also includes alignment with new Environmental Protection Agency and Housing and Urban Development standards and regulations regarding Lead Hazard Mitigation and Certificates of Lead Conformance, which authority to perform and/or enforce has been granted to RIDOH by the Housing Resource Commission.
