#### 2.4.4 Informal Dispute Resolution Process

Although I agree in content what the resolution is intended to accomplish I have the following questions:

- \* who makes up the resolution team? How many members make up the team?
- \* what are the qualifications of the team members?
- \* explain the process, i.e. who gives testimony to the team? can the management of the community call witnesses or submit written testimony?
  - \* is there a neutral part of the team? If so, how is that neutral party selected?
  - \* Is there an appeal process? What is the process?
  - \* Can the licensee residence avail themselves of the services of an attorney to represent the interest of the community?

### 2.4.34 - Variance Procedure

Questions:

- \* Does this apply to Limited Health provision or regular Assisted Living Regulation?
- \* Is the assisted living residence staff permitted to change the Foley catheters if dislodged or is a physician required to perform the procedure?
- \*Are residents housed in a Memory Care Unit permitted to have a Foley Catheter? If so, doesn't this pose a health(infection control) and safety risk?

\*If a Foley catheter dislodges on a shift when a license nurse is not in the building, does the resident have to be transported to the ER?
