Regulatory Analysis Summary and Supporting Documentation:

By promulgating a regulation that describes requirements and limitations pertaining to Medicaid payments for sterilization and hysterectomyservices, EOHHS will resolve compliance uncertainties faced by providers and help toensure that those who require these services are able to access them.

In the development of this proposed adoption, considerationwas given to: (1) alternative approaches; (2) overlap or duplication with otherstatutory and regulatory provisions; and (3) significant economic impact onsmall business. No alternative approach, duplication, or overlap was identified based upon available information.
