Summary of Rulemaking Action:

This amendment reflects a change in the income eligibility requirements for the Medicare Premium Payment Program that was made in the fiscal year (FY) 2026 Enacted Budget. The FY 2026 budget increased the effective income limit for Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries (QMBs) and Qualifying Individuals (QIs) by applying income disregards. The effective income limits increased from 100% of the federal poverty level (FPL) to 125% FPL for QMB, and from 135% FPL to 168% FPL for QI. This amendment includes other technical and clarifying edits.

Regulatory Analysis Summary and Supporting Documentation:

This update is needed to align with the FY 2026 budget. Other technical revisions are expected to clarify current practice. In the development of this proposed adoption, consideration was given to: (1) alternative approaches; (2) overlap or duplication with other statutory and regulatory provisions; and (3) significant economic impact on small business. No alternative approach, duplication, or overlap was identified based upon available information.
