To update the current editions of NFPA 1, *Fire Code* and NFPA 101, *Life Safety Code* from the 2015 editions to the 2018 editions and to update the current edition of NFPA 72, *National Fire Alarm and Signaling Code* from the 2013 editions to the 2019 edition. In addition, all current Formal Interpretations and Blanket Variances to the existing editions have been incorporated.

**Regulatory Analysis Summary and Supporting Documentation:**

After considering each of the proposed changes and the alternative means of achieving the goals of each provision, the Fire Safety Code Board of Appeal and Review has determined that the benefits of the proposed changes to the State Fire

Safety Code justifies the cost of the proposed rule; and that the proposed rule will achieve the objectives of the authorizing statute in a more cost-effective manner, or with greater net benefits, than other regulatory alternatives.
