The Commission has determined, that to stay within the FY 2020 Livable Home Modification Grant program appropriation of \$499,397, the program's regulation 525-RICR-20-00-3 must be amended. There were 45 home modification projects that were approved, before the end of the fiscal year and an additional 34 applications conditionally approved or pending on June 30th that will be carried into FY 2020. A conservative estimate of those project's cost is \$206,967, or 41% of FY 2020 Enacted Budget's \$438,069 allocated for grants see table below.

After considering the implications of a 41% reduction in funding of new modification grants and the last 18 months experiences, including testimony at 3 appeals hearings, the Commission's Executive Committee directed staff to submit the amendments to 525-RICR-20-00-3 Rhode Island Livable Home Modifications that:

 Reduce in Section 3.5 B. Livable Home Modification Grants, the maximum reimbursement from \$5,000 to \$4,000, which would increase the number from 161 in FY 19 to ~183, and if reallocation is approved ~191 grants.

- Exclude in <u>Section 3.6 F. Qualifications</u>, any retrofit that is eligible for reimbursement, by a
 healthcare insurance policy, ensuring that the individuals receiving state funds are those with
 the greatest need.
- Revise in Section 3.4. Definitions "1. Accessible features" to:
 - Reword c. "Doors" revised to "Doorways"; and d. Hallways and passages. Wheelchairs
 are getting wider, and the Veterans Administration is recommending doorways in their
 facilities should be 41 inches of clear opening, much greater than 32 inches in the 2010
 ADA Accessibility Guidelines.
 - Add "h. Handrails and grab bars". Thirty percent (30%) of individuals admitted to nursing homes are due to fall within the prior 180 days; and
 - Add "I. Appliances or alarms that can be easily reinstalled in another residence would not meet the definition of an accessibility feature."

- Revise in <u>Section 3.4. Definitions:</u>
 - Add a definition "2. Building codes". Require proof that required building permits and certification of occupancy were issued. Although this requirement may be more burdensome, the building code permit cost is eligible for reimbursement, and the goal is to ensure safety of the beneficiary and all projects meet legal life safety requirements;
 - Add a definition "9. Modify", "modification" or "modifying", deleting in the remainder of the regulation the words used in the definition (i.e. construction and renovation);
 - Reword definitions 11. "Qualified {healthcare} professional"; and 13. "Sensory modifications"; and
 - Renumber Section 3.4 Definitions.
- Clarify in <u>Section 3.7 Application</u>:
 - Recognize that applications could be prepared and signed by a power of attorney;
 - Require a contractor/installer's quote or estimate total cost of the accessibility features and/or sensory modifications to the residence be attached to the application.
 - The cost of any renovations not included in the definitions of the "Accessibility features" or "Sensory modifications" must be listed separately on the quote or cost estimate.
 - The contractor/installer must submit an affidavit declaring that all required building code permits shall be obtained prior to the retrofit is started.
 - Documentation of the medically necessary expenses that required withdrawals from a retirement account or pension fund.
- Revise <u>3.8 Financial Eligibility</u> by requiring a resident who has disability, but not required to file a federal tax return in the prior year, to submit an affidavit declaring that the resident was not required to file a federal tax return in the prior year; and
 - Deleting the list of exemptions from the resident's taxable income used to determine the applicant's "countable income".
- Add a new <u>Section 3.9 Approval of application</u> that details the process for applications to be reviewed and approved:
 - A Livable Home Modification Grant Award letter would be issued once all required documentation is provided.
 - That award would expire 120 days after the award letter is mailed by the Commission, unless the retrofit has begun or a contract for the retrofit has been signed and a copy submitted to the Commission.
- Add a new <u>Section 10 Termination of a Grant Award</u>, describing the notification process and that the individual may reapply by submitting a new application to the Commission.
- Revise and renumber Section 3.9 as <u>3.11 Filing a Claim for Reimbursement</u>, to request the submission of all necessary building permits, to ensure compliance with all residential provisions of the building, electrical, elevator/lift, fire, and plumbing codes, in addition to the accessibility code. This will to ensure safety of the beneficiary and that the project meets all the legal life safety codes.
- Add a new <u>Section 3.12 Application Denial and Appealing an Application Denial</u>.
 - A letter denying an application for a Livable Home Modification Grant must:
 - i. Be sent by USPS Certified Mail letter with Return Receipt to the mailing address on the application;
 - ii. Indicate the provision(s) of this part that are the reason for denial; and
 - iii. Include the procedure for appealing the denial.
 - An appeal letter must be postmarked within thirty (30) days of receipt of a denial letter and indicate the grounds for the appeal.
