Rule 3: Practice before the Commission.

- 3.01 Any person may appear before the Commission in his or her own behalf. Except as may otherwise be provided by law, no person may appear in a representative capacity before the Commission other than (A) attorneys at law duly qualified and entitled to practice before the Supreme Court of the State of Rhode Island, (B) attorneys at law duly qualified and entitled to practice before the Commission for Human Rights under the authority of a decision by the Rhode Island Supreme Court, a Supreme Court Rule, or as otherwise authorized by law, (C) such other persons as by law are expressly authorized to appear in representative capacities.
- 3.02 All persons in proceedings before the Commission in a representative capacity shall conform to the standards of ethical conduct required of attorneys before the courts of Rhode Island. If any such person does not conform to such standards, the Commission may decline to permit such person to appear in a representative capacity in any proceeding before the Commission.
